#### Dining Hall Plan

#### Early Bird Fee

This fee is due **no later than May 21, 2018**  
Great Trail Units—\$265  
Out of Council Units—\$275

#### Basic Fee

This is the fee you pay if paid by the **Friday following your 10 day meeting**  
Great Trail Units—\$285  
Out of Council Units—\$295

#### Late Fee

This is the fee you pay at check-in  
Great Trail Units—\$300  
Out of Council Units—\$310
